I have lived in Lebanon my whole life with my parents and siblings and ever since I can remember Christ has been a significant part of our family. How many moments have I missed with my family? How many moments in the presence of Jesus have I wasted? How many opportunities for service have I missed out on?

It has been said that the best way to discover one's true values is to evaluate their calendar and their check book. As I keep track of my time, I become increasingly convicted that there are many areas of my life that I have not fully given over to Jesus, even though I thought I had.

As I evaluate my own time management, I see God answering the prayer quoted above. As a result of this new discipline, I have been able to meet other personal goals, such as reading through the bible in seven months. I have also become more aware of opportunities as they present themselves and more eager to make the best use of my time.

I have seen the benefit of "numbering my days," and I encourage you to prayerfully consider doing the same. Perhaps we will discover that we have much more time to invest in worship, loving our families, and serving our communities than we think we do. Perhaps we have much more potential for bearing fruit to the glory of God than we realize.
