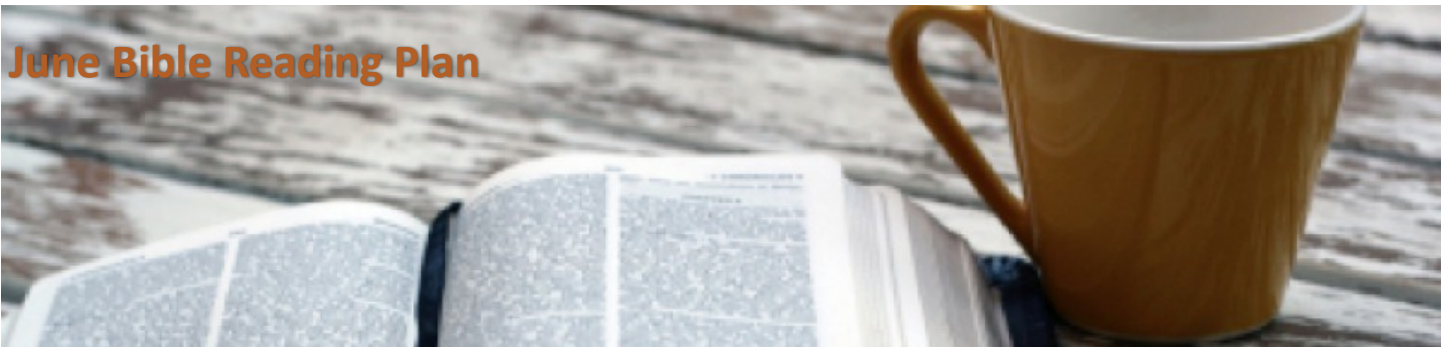

In 1966 I bought a piano, instead of a car, and Curt thought he needed to “see” the piano, so on New Year’s day in 1967 he took me home to Portland to “see my piano!” That was the beginning of our “life” together! We were engaged on February 14th and were married on September 9, 1967.

We built a home on a piece of property that we bought from his parents in 1968-69 and our first child, a girl, was born in 1970. Our second child, another girl, was born in 1972. Number three, a boy, came along in 1975. We thought our family was a good size but then number four, another boy, came in 1983. We have four granddaughters and one grandson.

Our number two daughter settled in Sweet Home. We had been thinking that change was coming to our lives as we grew older and knew that we didn’t want to wait until our children had to make the decision for us to change our living situation. Joanna knew that Wiley Creek Retirement Community in Sweet Home might be a good place for us, so she encouraged us to visit and check it out. We did and liked what we saw, so we put our name on the “list.” We arrived on February 15, 2020...just three Sundays before COVID 19 reared its ugly head! The apartment we got could not be a better fit for us.
